

# ISLAM 101 (Ramadan Mubarak)

It takes a strong person to be Muslim. I can say that because I am. Daily I face ignorant statements made about my religion and discriminations based on falsehood. There is a common statement made that if someone doesn't know about something that they tend to fear it. Well I have to ask the question then who really has the problem? In today's world, the media is really to blame for the majority of the misconceptions you see regarding Islam. If you did not grow up around Muslims and all you ever saw was a terrorist on TV, then you tend to believe that that is what Islam is all about. Nothing could be farther from the truth.

Very briefly I will explain the basics of Islam. I would rather more people know the truth than make untruthful statements because you don't know any better. One thing God definitely gave us all is a brain. I would think that is a place where you have nothing but time to strengthen your largest muscle; you would use it to educate yourself. Knowledge is power. Ignorance is oppression.

THE FIVE PILLARS OF ISLAM I SHAHADAH – profession of faith

II SALAH – prescribed prayer
III SAUM – prescribed fasting
during the month of Ramadan
IV ZAKAT – prescribed charity
V HAIJJ – prescribed pilgrimage

## ZAKAT

It is often compared to the system of <u>tithing</u> and <u>alms</u> but unlike these older systems, it serves principally as the <u>welfare</u> contribution to poor and deprived people in the Muslim lands, although others may have a rightful share. It is the duty of the state not just to collect it; but to distribute it fairly as well. In the Qur'an, God Revealed the beneficiaries of *zakat*:

"Alms are only for the poor and the needy, and the officials (appointed) over them, and those whose hearts are made to incline (to truth) and the (ransoming of) captives and those in debts and in the way of Allah and the wayfarer; an ordinance from Allah; and Allah is knowing, Wise." [Qur'an 9:60]


People whose hearts are to be reconciled include (normally new Muslims or those close to becoming Muslim. Even non-Muslims could be included):

- Freed slaves
- Those heavily burdened with paying their debts
- Travelers who find themselves in difficult circumstances

There have been cases where you can't pay zakat for


- Traditional zakaat laws generally do not cover trade.
- It is not permissible to pay zakaat to some members of the family (i.e.
  grandparents, parents, spouses, children), for if they were needy or poor,
  they are under the custody of the eligible man, while Zakat is intended for
  public welfare.
- Zakat doesn't become obligatory on a <u>Muslim</u> if he doesn't have a minimum amount in his possession that has remained unchanged for a whole lunar year; any increase in that money during the year waits for the following year and any decrease as long as the total amount is still above the minimum amount is exempted.



# You to Know It. Does the FDA Have a Hidden Agenda?

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) is close to letting into our food supply meat and milk from cloned livestock and their offspring. This is a really bad idea, and worth complaining about; they have asked for comments. An easy way to send them in is by going to the site set up by the True Food Network. The final decision will not be made until the beginning of April. The FDA claims that cloned meat and milk are safe, in fact so much like ordinary meat and milk that they need not be checked or labeled. This assertion has been demolished by Denise Caruso of the Hybrid Vigor Institute in the San Jose Mercury News, and by Dr. Mae-Wan Ho and Prof. Joe Cummins of the Institute of Science and Society, among others. Basically the FDA did not see any risk because they did not look where they might find it.

Nine out of ten clones don't even make to birth; many that do, die soon afterwards. A few do grow up and superficially appear normal, but experts suggest that they never really are. MIT's Rudolf Jaenisch put it succinctly in *Time* last year:

"If you reprogram, it affects the whole genome. From what we know, I would argue that cloned animals cannot be normal. They can be closer to normal, but not normal."

But by the FDA's proposed rules, if a cloned animal looks OK to a farmer, then that marketable asset can be milked, mated or slaughtered without further concern. If it looks seriously ill, then it is subject to current regulations, but no more than that. And the offspring of cloned livestock mated with normal partners are assumed — note, assumed — to be healthy.

One particularly dubious aspect of the FDA's logic is their assertion that a "side effect" that occurs very rarely in nature, but vastly more often in a cloned or genetically engineered organism, is still somehow a "natural" byproduct. If something ever happens naturally, even once, then it cannot be considered unusual no matter how often it occurs under artificial circumstances. This is absurd, and the data that follow to illustrate this

are in their own Risk Assessment, a 4.24 MB pdf linked from here.

Many clones, especially of cattle, suffer from Large Offspring Syndrome (LOS), meaning they are born at least 20% bigger than usual. LOS is associated with many harmful traits, such as a weak or absent suckle reflex, deformities, poor organ development, increased susceptibility to infection, enlarged heart &/or failure of lungs to inflate. In 12 studies collected by the FDA, 232 of 388 calves had LOS (60%), and 166 died (from Table V-4 on pp. 119-120). LOS does happen without cloning, though only when the embryos have been created in vitro, or the mothers are deliberately fed an experimentally poisonous high-nitrogen diet. The FDA uses this skimpy rationale to claim that "no adverse outcomes have been noted in clones that have not been observed in animals derived via other ARTs or natural mating" (p. 306).

But LOS is still a little-understood and often lethal abnormality that, by the FDA's own report, occurs twice as often in cloned calves as in IVF-produced ones where the embryos are fertilized with sperm — and rarely if ever after "natural mating." Something is going wrong on a deep genetic level, so wrong that the poor surrogate mothers often have to suffer caesarians and may even die. It is simply not a valid argument to say that we should ignore this problem because other factors can produce it, especially when cloning makes it so much worse.

There are many more reasons to be concerned. For those seeking more information, the Center for Food Safety (CFS) has compiled a helpful pdf fact-sheet and is also using MySpace, BlogSpot and YouTube to spread the word, as well as their own website and the related True Food Network. CFS is pressing the FDA with a combination of grassroots activism (along with Ben and Jerry's) and a lawsuit, in which it is joined by:

Consumer Federation of America

Food and Water Watch

Friends of the Earth

The American Anti-Vivisection Society

The Humane Society of the United States

The Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice

The Center for Environmental Health

The Organic Center has weighed in with a dispassionate analysis of the FDA's report (a 1.2 MB pdf, linked from here). They clearly oppose this use of cloning technology, which is not allowed under organic standards, though they note dryly that:

The presence in the marketplace of unregulated and unlabeled meat and milk from cloned animals will help further differentiate organic products from unsegregated conventional livestock products. This will almost certainly increase demand for organic meat and animal products.

You don't have to be vegan, or vegetarian, or even someone who insists on eating organic out of concerns about hormones or pesticides, to be concerned about clones. You don't have to be an animal-rights activist to want to minimize the cruelty inflicted on livestock. In fact, all the polls show that huge majorities are against cloned livestock, including a whole series from Gallup and most recently one from the Pew Initiative on Food and Biotechnology. Meanwhile, the January 2007 issue of Nature Biotechnology published the results of a massive global survey coordinated by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre, which revealed that the livestock industry itself regards the commercial prospects of cloning as poor, except perhaps for elite male pigs. In other words, the potential benefits are tiny, so any cost at all (including concerns about safety, cruelty or social effects) has a relatively large effect on the cost/benefit assessment equation. Still, James Greenwood, former Congressman and current CEO of the Biotechnology Industry Organization (BIO), remains an uncompromising supporter, telling the Bucks County Courier Times on February 5th (no longer free online) that:

"I don't think there are any ethical issues whatsoever. We're not talking about human beings here, we're talking about cows and pigs. Just because you're cloning cows and pigs doesn't mean you're going to be cloning human beings."

Human reproductive cloning may well never happen, because the technology is so error-prone, but preparing the public for other kinds of human genetic interventions may be the real point of this exercise, as pointed out (by me) at the <u>Biopolitical Times blog</u>.



Elite opinion is somewhat divided on this issue. Some of the reporting has reflected an unquestioning acceptance of the FDA's risk assessment, but several bills are being introduced, at both federal and state level, to require labeling of cloned products. (If they fail, and the products appear, expect to see competing "clone free" labels.) The New York Times came out against cloning livestock, with a notably insightful editorial:

"Asking whether cloned meat and milk are safe is not even the right question. The right question is, why clone at all? ... Are we willing to judge the suitability of new technologies in ways that fully address their ethical and biological complexities? Or are we doomed to give in to politics and the bottom line?"

Livestock cloning is unneeded, unwanted, and quite likely unsafe. If you want to keep cloned animal products out of our food supply, please tell the FDA now. Will your comments really make a difference? They might: A powerful head of steam is building up to stop or at least slow this approval. And even if the FDA presses ahead, a large outpouring of public complaint now could be important for the future, when there will be more and more decisions to be made about commodifying not just plant and animal but human life through biotech. This is an opportunity to lay down markers about what is and is not acceptable.







# 15 Minutes of Fame

Ready for the World - often ignored in modern retrospectives of 80's music, during 1985-1988 there were few acts that were bigger than Ready For the World. Their Jheri curl look made them the young heartthrobs of R&B/Pop music, and their series of hit dance cuts and ballads, were absolutely infectious.

Formed in the early 80's in Flint, Michigan by singer/songwriter Melvin Riley along with Gordon Strozier, John Eaton, Willie Triplett, Gerald Valentine and Gregory Potts, Ready for the World scored sizeable hits with the first two singles, the ballads "Tonight" and "Deep Inside Your Love." But it was their third single, the magnificent Prince-sounding electronic dance tune "Oh Sheila," that moved the group to the top of the Pop and Soul charts. The song became one of the year's biggest pop hits.

Willie Triplett of Ready for the World was gracious enough to sit down with me for an interview. He and his wife live about five minutes away. Yes, he and my husband are first cousins. They grew up very close. If you look back on some of their album's you will see Rufus' name as songwriter. Here's a little about the group and my interview:

Do you see Ready for the World as pioneers? I don't but other people do. We've heard that a lot from people in the industry and "fans". What do you most want to be remembered for? We haven't accomplished this yet but we're working on it. I want most to be remembered for AUTHENTICITY. If anything, that is what I would like to be remembered for.

What's the craziest thing a female has done to get the group's attention? We were at Disneyland performing across the water and a female jumped in the water to get to us. You had electricity going throughout with the lights and all and that was kinda crazy.

Have any of the members had any run-ins with the law? Absolutely! We've all had run-ins with the law. We've had issues, sometimes domestic; I'm just going to be real with it. Sometimes whether it be tinted windows, or suspended licenses or whatever the case may be. We go thru the normal aspects of living and being citizens.

What about drug use. Did that play apart in any of the group's lives? Nah, not at all. So far no member has been indicted, caught or accused or any wrong doing drug wise.

What keeps you grounded? The overall love of the craft.

Is there a criminal element in the music business? I believe so. Again, I'm just going to keep it real. It can be cutthroat at times, unnecessarily. I think that we can all be in this industry and make money. It doesn't have to be cutthroat, people stabbing each other in the back for whatever reason. In the beginning when we first started out, there was a lock code on the industry from managers, to labels to radio stations, but I feel that has changed and the artist has gained a lot more control. Even though that element still exists, the artist has gained a lot more control.

What would you say is the biggest myth about being in the music business? The biggest myth is that you don't have to work for it. Of course you have those one hit wonders. The artists don't make themselves. It takes a whole background of people to make the artist big. So the biggest myth that the artist did it by themselves is bull. And I don't care who you are, it's not happening.

Do all of the members have a college background or skills to fall back on? I think all of the members have skills to fall back on. Every member does no have a college background. Only a few of us have had some college. I don't think it's necessary in this society to always have a college background. I think if you have the wherewithal and the will to go out and get your hustle on, I think that you can succeed in this society.

With all of what you are seeing going on with young Black men, what do you think of the criminal justice system? I think it needs to be totally revamped. I know that our young guys need guidance but they don't all need to be thrown in jail and the key thrown away. So it definitely needs to be revamped and law enforcement needs to refocus on how they treat us.

What words of encouragement can you give to all of the prisoners reading this article? I think that regardless of what your situation is you have to concentrate on your future. Whether that be five years away or ten years away, concentrate and start rebuilding yourself. If you do that you can handle anything that comes your way. Put God first; believe in yourself and then everything else.

Mint Condition-For nearly two decades, they are more than an average group or band....they become, in fact, Mint Condition. After five successful studio albums, over a dozen hit singles, multiple world tours, the band remains just as popular as ever. Every member of the band, including keyboardists Lawrence El and Keri Lewis, guitarist O'Dell and keyboardist/ saxophonist Jeffrey, came of age in the Twin Cities (St. Paul &Minneapolis) and were inspired by Prince's electrifying hybrid of funk, soul and pop (now known as "The Minneapolis Sound,"). The young men knew of one another peripherally, but the collaborations didn't fall into place until they united under Central High School's performing arts program; O'Dell and Stokley, who had a steel drum class together, absorbed the musicians after practicing sessions in Stokley's home basement. "There was a performing arts class that we were all in," says Lawrence of that fertile period. "A lot of singers around town would hire musicians and we ended up playing in gigs together as the backing band. It happened so often that eventually, we decided to just do it all ourselves." And if the sudden implosion of record labels weren't enough of a change, another one loomed on the horizon; in 2001, two years after...Aquarium's release, Keri Lewis departed from the band to produce and tour with his future wife, Toni Braxton; according to his band mates, the split was an amicable one. "We talk on the phone at least once a month and we run into him every now and then.

Stokley: Oh really, why?

Jenny: Because I am going to put it up like a

Battle of the Bands.

Do you see Mint Condition as pioneers? I'm not sure. Maybe some people see us as new pioneers. Our sound is just a culmination of all of the groups we were inspired by; bands and vocal groups. I guess the way that we package it some people consider it new. We continue to be inspired and do new things such as E-Life, our new album.

What do you most want to be remembered for? Being true to yourself no matter what the obstacles. There are so many things I could say but staying true to self is very important. People are always going to have their comments and feel you should do things this way or that way. But as long as it is true to us, then we go with it.

What's the craziest thing a female has done to get the group's attention? There have been a few things. Of course you have your preverbal throwing the undergarments on stage. And then you get the extreme of somebody sending the keys to their house with the code to the alarm system being my birth date and their birth date. That's pretty wild. There are so many examples but that's one of the wildest to me.

Have any of the members had any run-ins with the law? I'm sure being a Black man in America, who hadn't, hell? I mean hey, I'm just being real. What about drug use. Did that play apart in any of the group's lives? I'm sure all of us have experimented when we were younger. You gotta climb knuckle head hill. I lived 2 blocks right around the corner from the hood. The area I lived in was pretty cool but literally a block away was mess. I don't know how any of us made it out. Rick the bass player is from the South Side of Chicago and you know what that's about. Just by the grace of God and after school programs we made it out. I can understand young cats coming up today that have these negative influences around and getting into trouble because of nothing to do. It is important to give them something to do.

What keeps you grounded? Family. Living in the Midwest is a grounding experience. I always say that we work the hoopla but we don't live it. We come home, regroup, re-energize and then head out again, North, South, East, West, overseas, wherever we have to go. Family and friends keep it real and we can be ourselves. I would hate to have to walk around with a bodyguard. I enjoy the freedom that we have living here.

Is there a criminal element in the music business? I think so. Any time there is that type of money generated in anything, not only music, I'm talking about government as well, there's always going to be something there. You deal a lot on a cash basis, payola is still going on and so yes I believe that you will always have some type of criminal element, not just Mafioso.

What would you say is the biggest myth about being in the music business? Once you get in and get signed you're rich and it's the end of your problems. That is not the case like most people think. Most young people coming thru that's what they see. It's a lot of hard work and if you have any type of success, that's when the work really begins. You think getting in is hard? Staying in is even rougher.

Do all of the members have a college background or skills to fall back on? Some of us. Lawrence is back in school studying Physics. Jeffrey, the keyboard player, just got his degree in Criminal Justice. I'm still trying to put the nail and coffin on some of these languages, mainly Spanish. We're all always into something.

With all of what you are seeing going on with young Black men, what do you think of the criminal justice system? From the little bit that I do know, some of us know that it is unfair. It's not balanced and it all basically comes down to money. Everybody trying to get paid. All of these quotas being met. I got stopped the other day. I really don't know why I got stopped. He said it was something different but he really couldn't explain to me what it really was. So after he ran my license and saw that I was clean, no issue existed. There is a lot of unfair things that goes on. It's jacked up but the system has some deep problems going on.

What words of encouragement can you give to all of the prisoners reading this article? Keep ya head up. Don't give up. Don't just play cards and lift weights. Use the time wisely. It's a lot of great examples that have come out of prison. I would say use that example of like a Malcolm X or someone like that. There are many others but use the time that you have to reflect. There are many that are in there that are innocent. Stay strong. I've never been to prison and ain't looking to go. From what I've heard it ain't really no place to be. You have to live by a different code. Stay strong.

#### Woman arrested 32 years after prison escape

SAN DIEGO (AP) — A woman who escaped from a Detroit prison 32 years ago has been arrested in San Diego, where she was living under a false name, authorities said.

U.S. Marshals say 53-year-old Susan Lefevre was taken into custody Thursday in the Carmel Valley area.

In 1976, Lefevre walked out of the Detroit House of Corrections after serving just one year of a 10- to 20-year sentence on conspiracy and drug convictions.

Using the name Marie Walsh, she married and raised three children. She lived in San Diego for nearly 10 years.

Authorities in late March received a tip saying Lefevre might be living in California as Marie Walsh. They confirmed it through a thumbprint match.

When she was arrested, Lefevre told marshal's deputies that her family had no idea she was a fugitive.

# California prison gets solar power plant


BLYTHE, Calif. (UPI) — Ironwood State Prison officials in California say they've activated a new 1.18 megawatt solar power plant.

The ground-mounted, photovoltaic plant that will produce more than 2.4 million kilowatt hours during its first year is the result of a public-private partnership with the SunEdison Co. of Beltsville, Md.

SunEdison financed, constructed and will operate the solar energy system. The California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation therefore avoids all upfront capital costs and will purchase the solar energy at predictable prices equal to or less than current retail rates, officials said.

SunEdison said its solar power system will produce no greenhouse gases, no noise and will use little to no water in operation.

Officials said the facility, during the next 20 years, is expected to produce more than 43 million kilowatt hours of solar energy, the equivalent of powering 4,107 homes and removing 3,770 cars from the road for one year.

Every messenger gave the same message even those you do not know.

# **SHU'AIB**

Among Abraham's descendants, and previous to Moses, is Shu'aib, who was sent to Midian, a city on the Red Sea. Shu'aib is generally considered to be the Arabic name for Jethro. He is also supposed to be the man whose daughter Moses married when he fled to Midian (28:27). He is mentioned four times in the Holy Qur'an, and in his teaching special stress is laid on the giving of full measure and weight. Thrice he is spoken of as being sent to Midian (7:85; 11:84; 29:36), and once as being sent to the dwellers of the thicket, ~ab *al-aika* (26: 176). Whether they were the same as the people of Midian cannot be said; in all probability they are identical, as the preaching in this case too is against defaultation in measure and weight. The following quotation is sufficient to give an idea of his preaching:

"And to Midian (We sent) their brother Shu'aib. He said: Oh my people, Serve Allah, you have no other god save Him. And give not short measure and weight. I see you in prosperity, and I fear for you the chastisement of an all-encompassing day:

And, Oh -my people, give full measure and weight justly, and defraud not men of their things, and act not corruptly in the land, making mischief:

What remains with Allah is better for you, if you are believers...

Oh my people, see you, if I have a clear proof from my Lord and He has given me a goodly sustenance from Himself... I desire nothing but reform, so far as I am able. And with none but Allah is the direction of my affair to a right issue." (11:84,88)

The people persisted in their evil ways and in their opposition to the prophet, and were ultimately destroyed by an earthquake (7:91).
